

Structure of Maritime Association

- The majority of countries (32) are structured as a single national association
- Belgium, Brazil, France, Netherlands and Italy are national associations acting as an umbrella for local or regional associations
- Turkey is split into one umbrella organisation and two sector-specific organisations

What is the structure of the Maritime Association in your country?




Member Types

- ► The majority (23) only have ship broking and/or ship agency companies as members
- Belgium, Brazil, France and Italy only have local or regional associations as members
- Angola has both ship agents and forwarding companies in membership
- Australia and Panama have both ship agents and shipping companies as members
- Germany has both local or regional associations and individual companies as members
- Australia, Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland, South Africa, Netherlands, Turkey and the USA allow individuals as members, often as Associate or Honorary Members

Categories of Membership


- ▶ 16 countries have more than one category of membership.
- Other than Full Members, other categories include Associate, Honorary, Observer and Branch Members.
- Some associations have a probation period before a company can gain Full Membership
- Voting rights vary between associations but in most cases are restricted to Full Members
- For the 4 umbrella organisations, membership is restricted to local associations only

Annual Dues Structure

- ► The majority of associations (22) charge a fixed annual fee per membership category
- One association charges liner agents an additional fee based on the NRT of the vessels they handle
- Three associations base the fee on the activity the member undertakes
- Two associations charge an additional fee for "special services"!
- Eleven associations can charge a fee on the number of port calls handled by the agent, but four do not do so

Do member agents have the right or practice of charging owner for Ship Agent Association dues via the final DA?





Total Number of Members (Companies):




Number of Association employees

Income sources


- ▶ 20 Members advised that 100% of their income comes from annual membership fees

Six to eight times per year - 2 Members


Quarterly - 4 Members
