2E3S and FONASBA-ECASBA sign a collaboration agreement to promote short sea shipping, coastal shipping and inland navigation

On the 3rd of March in Brussels representatives of the Escola Europea de Short Sea Shipping (2E3S) and the Federation of National Associations of Ship Brokers and Agents (FONASBA) signed a collaboration agreement to work together in developing projects that shall enhance short sea shipping, coastal and inland navigation worldwide. The Signing took place during the *ECASBA 2015 European Seminar*. ECASBA (the European Community Association of Ship Brokers and Agents), a subcommittee of FONASBA established in 1993 to represent European brokers and agents in their dealings with the European Union, will play a major role in the development and the progress of the agreement.

Under the agreement, FONASBA-ECASBA will work together with the Escola by promoting its courses and its project through its website and by promoting them across their membership base. Similarly 2E3S will contribute by ensuring visibility of FONASBA and its programmes in the professional courses, therewith increasing awareness and disseminating information about the EU transport policy, promoting the motorways of the sea, short sea shipping, coastal shipping, inland navigation and intermodality. Alongside the courses, for its part, 2E3S will also aid FONASBA in its efforts to position itself as a leader in the development of motorways of the sea, short sea shipping, coastal shipping, and inland navigation among the international institutions associated with the maritime industry.

The collaboration between the Escola and FONASBA will greatly contribute towards spreading the awareness of co- and multi-modal transport across Europe. 2E3S courses focus on the Mediterranean Motorways of the Sea, however their focus is pan-European and ensuring that professionals from across the continent attend the training will spread awareness of the Trans-European Transport Network, intermodal transport, short sea shipping, and EUs environmental policies.

FONASBA President Glen Gordon Findlay met with 2E3S Director Eduard Rodés to cement the collaboration on Tuesday in Brussels.
