


SAIL Programme objectives

National Shipping Agents Association President

- Appoints the National SAIL chair
- Oversees the appointments of the SAIL Committee
- Supports and monitors Port Associations SAIL Committees programme to ensure SAIL activities are conducted appropriately
- Checks labour legal status of the trainee and sees to the application of the local labour law

SAIL Committee: national chair

- Coordinates the activities within the National Association
- Communicates with:
- ECASBA
- National President
- Port Associations
- Appoints the national committee and defines specific responsibilities for each member
- Appoints a national participant protection officer

SAIL Committee responsibilities

- 1. Cooperate with Port Associations to enforce SAIL activities
- 2. Coordinate participant protection efforts within the SAIL
- 3. Manage outbound activities
- 4. Manage inbound activities
- 5. Implement risk management policies

SAIL Committee responsibilities

- 6. Develop Port Association programme guidelines and rules for participants that comply with ECASBA policy
- 7. Promote the programme through national association and port association Web sites, advertisements, and news stories.
- 8. Maintain effective lines of communication between all programme participants, including students, hosts (families), (counsellors), and Port Association members.
- 9. Designate one person, usually the National Association chair, to make reports to ECASBA

Escola Europea de Short Sea Shipping (2e3s.eu)

- 1. Initial training
- 2. Creation of a SAIL microsite to manage:
 - Registration
 - Support
 - Exchange information
 - Follow-up/evaluation (after the 1st week, after 3 months)
- 3. Support the National Association(s) to set the SAIL programme in motion

Programme launch

- Presentation of the programme at 3 different levels:
 - > FONASBA-ECASBA
 - National associations
 - > Local shipping agents
- 1 year (pilot)
- Budget
