Executive summary: This document comments on how maritime corruption has a negative effect, how it impedes social and economic development and how it may contribute to other risks such as security in ports on

 - Discussions with IMO Legal and FAL Committees to ascertain viability of developing maritime-specific interpretation of UN Declaration Against Corruption (UNODC)
 - Paper introducing MACN Guidelines on Anti-Corruption and success stories, Nigeria, Argentina et al.



- IAPH IMO Port-Related NGO Group:
 - IAPH, IBTA, ICHCA, IMPA, IPCSA, ISSA, FONASBA
 - Seeks to build on IMO's moves into shore-based issues following ISPS Code, SOLAS VI.2 revision
 - Brings together IMO NGO's operating in the shore-based shipping industry to influence policy as it applies to port matters
 - Initial meeting in London in September. Next step to identify common issues and consider options
 - International Chamber of Shipping as liaison with ship owners and operators
