
Role of ECSA

- ECSA offers a single point of contact and expertise to the EU policymakers in Brussels (Commission, European Parliament and Council)


Europe carbon neutral by 2050

Transport is responsible for almost 25% of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in the EU.




Ports

In the busiest sea ports:

→ at least 90% of container ships and passenger ships to have access to shore-side electricity supply


In most of the inland waterway ports:

→ at least one installation providing shore-side electricity (by 2030)




The FuelEU maritime regulation will oblige vessels above 5000 gross tonnes calling at European ports (with exceptions such as fishing ships):

→ to reduce the greenhouse gas intensity of the energy used on board as follows



Annual average carbon intensity reduction compared to the average in 2020



→ to connect to onshore power supply for their electrical power needs while moored at the quayside, unless they use another zero-emission technology
